The Twentieth Century Club is home to the Parks & Recreation office and hosts many programs, including marbles, piano, art, tai chi, and yoga. The Club is also available for community rentals and serves as a beautiful location for a wedding or special event.

1 PENNOCK WOODS 6.5 acres

This open space along Darby Creek is complemented by the Lansdowne Bird Sanctuary. Check out the streamside views and the "beach." This county-owned area is especially beautiful in the fall when the maple trees turn a brilliant shade of red.

2 SHRIGLEY WOODS 6.5 acres

This county-owned open space features steep, wooded slopes divided by seasonal streams that support a vernal wetland. Enter along Scottdale Road at Hilldale Road. Watch your step!

3 HOFFMAN PARK 8 acres

Hoffman Park is the main athletic facility for local sporting events including soccer, softball, basketball and tennis. Hoffman hosts many annual Park & Recreation events, including the spring egg hunt, movie nights on summer evenings and Park Day in September. Parking is available at either end of the park. The Gateway Park trail connects to Baltimore Avenue.

4 BELMONT PARK 3.9 acres

This park features a junior-size basketball court, play equipment, swings, picnic area and sloped open areas suitable for picnicking and field games, surrounded by mature shade trees.

5 RESERVOIR PARK 1.4 acres

For years, this site existed as a drained reservoir until the park was opened to the public in 2004. It features a small creek, a tributary of the Darby Creek, a small wetland area and native vegetation.

6 MARLYN PARK 3 acres

Located at the confluence of Falls and Avery Run, this scenic park is the perfect place to enjoy nature, with its large mature trees and dramatically sloped grass areas.

7 INTERBORO PARK 3 acres

This park features a full-size basketball court and open areas suitable for a pickup game of soccer or touch football. A nature trail runs through wooded, vernal wetland area at the south end of the park.

8 HAYES PARK 1.2 acres

This park features a full-size basketball court, swings, play equipment, and picnic tables tucked into the surrounding neighborhood.

9 SYCAMORE PARK 1 acre

Sycamore Park is named for its historic 300-year-old sycamore tree, which is the symbol of Lansdowne. The land for the park was acquired through the hard work and dedication of the residents and civic groups in Lansdowne. The meditative setting is complemented by perennial gardens and flowering shrubs.

10 VETERANS PARK

A memorial to our veterans, Veterans Park is located across Lansdowne Avenue from the Lansdowne Theater.

11 BOROUGH GREEN

Located right in the heart of Lansdowne, this greenspace is adjacent to Borough Hall.
